

Getting to the Festival

There is no parking onsite from Sat July 31st - Mon Aug 2. The various options available to you are:

ETS Volunteer Shuttle

There is an early morning shuttle at 7:00 AM from Windsor Park station.

Taxi

Coop Taxi will have drop off and pick up zones inside the park. To book a taxi, please call 780-425-2525.

Bicycle

Ride your bike to Hawrelak Park, lock your bike in one of the bike lock-ups, and enjoy the Festival worry-free knowing that your bike are nice and secure in our supervised bike lockups. These are manned by our friends at Bike Edmonton, a non-profit organization that offers cycling resources. There are two locations, one at the north entrance and one at the south. (see Festival Map).

Walking

If you live nearby, why not walk? Enjoy the beautiful view and avoid traffic.

ETS Bus Passes

- ETS passes available 1 per volunteer
- ETS passes pick up when:
 - July 30th between 1:00 pm 9:00 pm (Hawrelak Park, Volunteer Central)
 - During the Festival from Volunteer Registration
 (Hawrelak Park, Volunteer Central)

EHFA Volunteer Pass (timedentry pass)



These passes are REQUIRED for entry and are available on EventBrite.



There is a tutorial on the heritagefest site (https://www.heritagefest.ca/current-volunteers) that shows how to get these passes. Volunteer passes are good for all 3 days!!

Things to know about Timed-Entry Passes



QR codes to get passes will be placed at every bus terminal in the city and will be up in Hawrelak Park before the entrances



People will show up without them. We will be letting them in anyways. Some people may not have phones or access to internet



Even though the pass has 2-hour time slots on it, patrons can stay as long as they want



There are 2 types of volunteer Entry Passes - EHFA Volunteer & Pavilion Volunteer. Both are good for all 3 days

Volunteer Central Location


Has moved back to the entrance of the park where it was in 2017

Volunteer Meals

- Volunteers will receive chits (poker chips) from their section supervisor during their shift.
- Volunteers will receive one chit per shift to be exchanged for a meal at the pavilion of their choice.
- All pavilions are participating.



No tickets this year

- No food tickets
- Only debit or credit
- NO cash

Once you've reached the park...

- 1. Go to any of the 3 entrances and have your EHFA Volunteer Pass scanned to enter the park.
- 2. Follow the map on the 'Getting to Volunteer Central' page of this handbook to get to Volunteer Central.
- Once you have reached Volunteer Central, sign in at registration. They will give you your t-shirt and directions on where to go from there.
- 4. Head to your shift!
- 5. Have fun!
- Once you have completed your shift for the day, return to Volunteer Central to sign-out or sign out on the Volunteer Local app.

Volunteer Responsibilities

- Treat each person you encounter with respect & compassion. This includes other volunteers, performers, vendors, staff, and the public.
- Please arrive at least 15 minutes early for your shift to allow for time to check in at Volunteer Central and to make your way to your area.
- Wear your volunteer t-shirt while on shift. If you are volunteering on more than one day,
 please bring your t-shirt with you for each one (only one t-shirt per volunteer is given out).
- Remember to bring a water bottle or use your Heritage Festival water bottle to stay hydrated!
- Dress for the weather. Hot out? Bring sunscreen and a hat! Raining? Bring your rain jacket or umbrella!
- st please be aware that there are no secure storage facilities on—site during the festival.
- If you are given Information Materials, please read through them.

- Complete assigned tasks and help each other out while making the most of your experience!
- At any time, please ask questions if you do not understand!
- Cancel any shift(s) you are unable to make as soon as possible through your account OR let the Volunteer Coordinator know (min 24 hr notice appreciated).
- Make any necessary arrangements for childcare while you are volunteering (there are NO childcare areas at the Festival)
- Contact your Supervisor or Volunteer Coordinator if you have any concerns or a serious issue while volunteering.
- Remember to check out at the end of your shift at Volunteer Central.

Covid 19 Safety -Masks

• Our Stance - "Although public spaces do not require a mask in Edmonton, the Heritage Festival is a private event run by the Edmonton Heritage Festival Association with its own safety protocols. For our festival to safely operate this year, we kindly ask guests to wear masks unless eating. We apologize that our policy this year makes it harder for individuals who have difficulties with masks to attend. That being said: Maskexemption cards will be respected, Face shields are an acceptable face covering, Kids do not need to wear masks"

Covid 19 Safety – Masks

We will be offering PPE (masks) to everyone entering the park

Masks should be worn while on the festival grounds unless in a designated eating area

It is NOT the responsibility of the volunteer to confront anyone not following rules.

A person should only be reported to security IF they are behaving in an unsafe or disrespectful manner

Covid 19 Safety - Sanitizing

There will be hand sanitizer stations available throughout the park for volunteers and patrons to use

Frequently touched objects should be sanitized between different people using them

- Volunteers can park at Hawrelak on Thursday and Friday.
- Saturday they will need to take advantage of the FREE ETS Bus Pass.

Scholarship Program

Attention all post-secondary student volunteers! We have an amazing scholarship program thanks to the generosity of many of our sponsors. Scholarship amounts range between \$250 - \$1000 and are awarded by random draw from all eligible entries.

Eligibility Criteria:

- 2. Volunteer must be registered in a full-time program at an accredited Canadian post-secondary institution by December 31 of the year of the Festival (ex: for this year by Dec. 31, 2018).
- 3. Volunteer must complete a minimum of 10 hours to be entered into the draw.
- 4. More shifts = more entry forms!


How to enter to win a scholarship:

- 1. Once you have completed your two or more shifts, go to registration, ask for a scholarship form and fill it out.
- 2. Return the form to Volunteer Registration. They will verify your hours and enter you for the draw.
- 3. Names will be drawn in late August. Scholarships will be mailed early-mid September.

If you would like to volunteer more hours during the Festival to be eligible, please speak to your Volunteer Supervisor or email the Volunteer Coordinator to see what opportunities may be available!

We can provide letters of recognition and certificates verifying volunteer hours upon request. Please send all requests for letters and certificates to volunteer@heritagefest.ca. These will be sent out early-mid September.



FAQ

Q: When is Volunteer Orientation?

A: Volunteer Orientation for World Music Week is Monday July 26th at 7 PM via Zoom. Orientation videos will be available on www.heritagefest.ca/current-volunteers on Thursday evening so volunteers can watch and attend at a time that suits them best!

*Please note that not all sections have scheduled orientation sessions.

Q: Can I still volunteer if I can't attend orientation?

A: Of course! Orientation for most shifts is not mandatory. However, the orientation videos will be available online Thursday evening to watch at your leisure.

Q: When can I pick up my bus pass and t-shirt?

A: Passes will be available at the Heritage Fest Office from July 20th - 23rd from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm. If you are unable to pick up your passes during those dates, passes will also be available at Hawrelak Park on July 30th between 1:00 pm - 9:00 pm or anytime during the Festival from Volunteer Registration.

T-shirts will be picked up at Volunteer Registration on your first shift.

FAQ continued...

- Q: Can my friend and I volunteer in the same place/job/shift?
- A: Most sections you can volunteer with a friend.
- Q: Can I bring my stuff with me?
- A: Please do not bring your stuff. We do not have a secure storage place for you to place your items. Valuables should be left at home!
- Q: How old do you have to be to volunteer?
- A: All volunteers between the ages of 13 15 must volunteer with a parent or quardian. All volunteers to be 18 or older.
- Q: Where is volunteer central located?
- A: Please see page titled 'Getting to Volunteer Central' for a detailed map and instructions.
- Q: Do I need to wear a mask?
- A: We are encouraging our staff and volunteers to wear masks but because it is no longer a requirement of the Alberta government, we will not be enforcing it. Staff and board will be modelling wearing the masks and we encourage our volunteers to do the same. However, it is not mandatory.
